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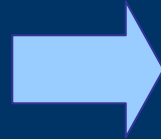

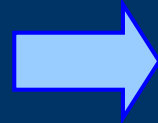

Characteristics of PPPs 1/2

PPPs can save money, but not always the case

PPPs does not mean free money for the government

In most cases, public sources have to provide (part of) the money for the infrastructure and its maintenance

PPPs are much more complex than conventional projects

Financing costs for PPPs are higher than for conventional projects

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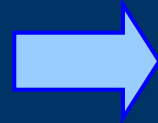
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Characteristics of PPPs 2/2

PPPs combine the advantages of the state sector (policy setting, lower funding costs) with the advantages of the private sector (efficiency, market orientation, inventiveness)

PPPs are long-term partnerships between the private sector and state agencies

PPPs commit governments for the next decades

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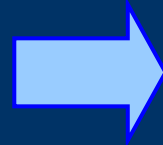
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PPP Prerequisites 1/2

It is much more difficult to prepare PPPs than conventional projects

To prepare PPPs requires commitment, resources and time

Expensive international advisors have to be hired to assist with the preparation of PPPs

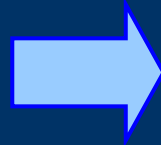
The transport sector, especially its financing has to be restructured before PPP can commence

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PPP Prerequisites 2/2

Restructuring of transport sector is part of PPP preparation

PPPs require long-term commitment from the government
(oft many decades)

PPPs require trust between government, investors and
banks

PPPs require independent legal systems

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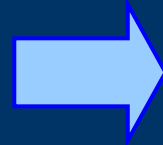
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Why PPPs?

Government is forced to restructure transport sector

Government is forced to think long-term

Private sector is better in designing, implementing and operating transport infrastructure

If done correctly, PPPs are worth the effort

If done incorrectly, PPPs are worse than conventional projects

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
